## Responsibilities

- What is the main objective of the career?
- What are the day to day tasks?

#### **Qualifications**

- What education is required
- What certifications, licenses, or other training is required?
- What tools, softwares, or procedures must the worker be trained in?

### <u>Importance</u>

- Why is this career important to protect water?
- How might the quality and availability of water change if this role didn't exist?
